

Happy Spring!! It was great to see so many people out for the Easter Egg Hunt at Clarkson Park last month. We enjoyed the "windy" afternoon playing cornhole with you and your kids, and being able to share information about the club's Southglenn Resident Rates for new members and those that have lapsed their membership for more than a year. This promotion ends May 1. If you've been procrastinating joining, now would be an even better value on an already inexpensive family recreational facility.

The majority of the survey respondents indicated the Club is important to this neighborhood! However, some of you noted you weren't members for a variety of reasons: kids are too young, kids have grown, health conditions or wouldn't be able to use the club enough. However, you can still be a member and help the Club tremendously for only \$100 – it's called a SOCIAL Membership. As a Social member you get these benefits:

- Enjoy all Club social events for member rates if applicable including: Adult and Family Glow Golf, Hawaiian Luau, and Casino Night, to name a few (some dates TBD)
- Rent the facility for private events (you can do this as a non-member, too!)
- Organize your own small group activity or social event for members (e.g. Gardening Club, Mother's Club, Date Night, or use your creativity to help us organize other fun member and community activities.)

- Pride knowing you are providing a form of financial assistance to a neighborhood recreational asset. Of course donations of any denomination are also welcome.
- I highly recommend that if you have kids around 5 or 6 you should consider joining the Club and getting involved with the Gators Swim Team. This organization has a great coaching staff and a diversely-aged team. It's helpful if your child can swim a length of the pool, but not required. Most kids improve enough to complete this by the end of the season. Plus, for swimmers 6 and under coaches can swim alongside of them, they can hold on to the lane line for brief respites, and they don't have to dive off the blocks or side of the pool. The coaches provide separate clinics and private training sessions to help build this skill in addition to the regular swim team practices. PLUS, this is a fantastic way to get to know other neighbors and their kids. We look forward to seeing you at the club.

INSPECT THE OUTSIDE OF YOUR HOME

Do a thorough inspection of the exterior of your home from top to bottom

CHECK YOUR ROOF

Carefully check your roof for any signs of damage such as leaks, missing shingles, buckling or sagging.

CHECK FOR AIR LEAKS

Check for any air that is leaking in or out of your home that may need caulking or weather stripping

Clean windows/screens power wash the outside as needed & replace any broken screens

Check to see if you see if there is any damage to your foundation

Check for squeaky doors and dripping faucets that may need to be repaired

CHECK YOUR ATTIC AND BASEMENT

Check your attic & basement for any common problems including pests, water damage & any other leaks

CHECK YOUR AIR OCNDITIONER

Inspect your A/C unit from top to bottom and look for leaks in the hoses and replace your air filter

Clean your ceiling fans, wipe down the trim and door throughout your home and have the furniture & drapes cleaned
