

A Closer Look

Several weeks ago, I happened to see Deputy Rivers with the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office stopped in our Southglenn neighborhood. I introduced myself and spoke briefly with him and I learned he is stationed in our area. He provided me with a contact card, and later that evening I reached out to him so see if he would be willing to sit down for an interview. I thought it would be interesting to learn more about some of the people working in our community. He agreed, and on March 23rd, I sat down with him at the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office. Here is how our conversation went.

1) How long have you been employed with the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office?

I began my career with the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office in July 2016. Prior to being hired with Arapahoe County, I spent two years with the Commerce City Police Department. Prior to becoming a police officer, I spent ten years in the Army.

2) What made you want to become a police officer?

My father was a police officer. I was able to spend time in the explorers program when I was younger. I was able to see how law enforcement serves the community. After my military service ended, I wanted to continue serving the community.

3) What do you like about you job?

My favorite part of the job is when I get a call where I can actually help someone, beyond just writing a report.

4) What do you like about the Southglenn/Centennial community?

I feel like the citizens enjoy and appreciate us, and we enjoy being out in the community helping the citizens.



5) What are you doing to help keep our community safe?

I team up with our crime analysis division and view concerns expressed by citizens. I also try to identify common issues and problems in order to address them. Some current examples of issues we are facing are motor vehicle crashes, driving under the influence, and motor vehicle theft. I try to focus my patrol in areas where these issues are more common.

6) Are there any issues in the community you think citizens should be aware of?

Currently we are getting several calls about theft from motor vehicles due to unlocked or unsecured vehicles, as well as thefts from puffers, (when people leave their unattended vehicle running with the keys inside).

7) What can we do as citizens to help keep our community safe?

Two ways citizens can help reduce the two issues mentioned above are to make sure they lock their cars and houses, and don't leave your car running unattended. Also, report suspicious activity and people to the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office.

8) What are some of the most difficult

calls you have responded to?

Any crime involving children as victims are always difficult.

9) Describe a typical day at work.

There really is no such thing as a "typical" day. I can start my shift writing a traffic ticket and end up performing CPR trying to save someone's life. The unknown of what my shift will bring is one of the parts of the job I enjoy.

10) Are you required to have a dash camera and or body worn camera. In your opinion, do you think this is helping improve community relations and police accountability?

We do not currently have dash cameras. The department is in the process of issuing body worn cameras, but not every deputy currently has one due to the size of our agency. I personally am glad we are being issued body worn cameras. It is a great tool, as long as everyone understands it is a tool with limitations. Some examples of limitations are the cameras do break, batteries die, and the cameras don't always record everything. Even with some limitations they are a great tool to show some of the challenges police face on a daily basis.

11) From your perspective, what is one of the most significant challenges facing law enforcement today? How is law enforcement working to improve this? Is there anything we in the community do to help overcome this challenge?



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I think one of the challenges facing law enforcement is public perception. For example, no one likes getting a ticket or being arrested. Law enforcement is always trying to improve community relationships, officers are offered extra trainings, and again body worn cameras may help as mentioned above. I encourage the community to get to know the law enforcement officers in your area. Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office offers a citizens academy, a ride along program, and you can always talk to an officer when you see them out in the community. I strongly encourage our ride along program, and enjoy giving citizens an opportunity to see what the job is like for us.

12) Is there anything you would like the community to know about you?

On a personal note, I moved to Colorado from North Carolina in 2008 while in the Army. I enjoy hunting and riding ATV's in the mountains. On a work note, I am always professional and treat citizens with respect.

Southglenn is home to the amazing & fun Drennen's Dreams Splash Dash 5K run/walk and we want you to join us! On Sunday, June 4th at Arapahoe High School, the race will begin at 9:00 a.m. Festivities and stretching begin at 8:30 in the northwest end of the West parking lot. If you've not participated as a homeowner on the race route or as a race registrant, it's lots of fun and we could really use your help to support our race!! As a homeowner, the Splash Dash needs you to help get our runners wet! In the past we've seen homeowners put out sprinklers or slip n' slides as well as throwing water balloons or getting out those water guns and seeing how accurate their shot is! You can also just spray runners with the hose if that suits your fancy (being mindful if they are running on the opposite side of the street as you, they may not wish to be sprayed). Whatever you choose to do to help get those runners wet is great as long as it's safe and in the spirit of fun!

If you are a runner and would like to participate, please visit our website at <u>DrennensDreams.org</u> and click on the Splash Dash registration logo on the home page. You'll be taken to our registration page where you can immediately register. The course was measured in 2013 for USA Track & Field (USATF) certification (Certificationi #CO13020DCR). The certification tells runners that the course is an accurate length, and split marks are in accurate locations.


The course map is shown so that you can see if your home is located on the route. We stretch and get the crowd going at

Arapahoe High School and then at about 8:45 a.m. we head over to the Start line. At 9 a.m. the race begins. The race is generally done on the route around 10:30 a.m. We will have course marshals assuring safe passage of our runners, so if you need to cross the race route, please be patient or plan to get out a little earlier that Sunday.
