The course map is shown below so that you can see if your home is located on the route. We stretch and get the crowd going at Arapahoe High School and then at about 8:45am we head over to the Start line. At 9am the race begins. We have runners who finish in 20 minutes or less, and we have walkers who are not in such a hurry. The race is generally done on the route around 10:30 am. We have over 17 sponsors who will have special and unique items just for the Splash Dash runners and there will be great food and plenty of activities for all ages to participate in.


Who is Drennen and what is the Drennen's Dreams
Foundation? The O'Melia Family are Southglenn residents. On June 5, 2010 Drennen Peter O'Melia opened his seventh competitive swim season by swimming the anchor leg on two winning relay teams and qualifying for All-Stars in his three individual events. The next day, June 6, Drennen drowned in three and a half to four feet of water near an unmanned lifeguard chair. Drennen went unnoticed for at least five minutes by the lifeguards who were on duty.

Since that day, the O'Melia family, our community and so many others have cried and grieved over the loss of Drennen. We've also questioned how his death could have been avoided and other families spared this pain. The Drennen's Dreams Foundation gives us a vehicle to turn our grief and questions into action.

Our Mission at Drennen's Dreams Foundation is to continue Drennen's legacy by promoting pool and water safety, and engaging the greater community to impact lives through initiatives that inspire well rounded individuals and the leaders of tomorrow. The annual Splash Dash 5K is our primary fundraiser to help us raise money to further our mission and support our community. **YOU** partner with us by joining us in the fun and registering to run/walk in the race - so please, take a moment to visit our website and register now. 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
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Plant a Row for the Hungry

Hunger In America

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, 1 in 8 households in the United States experiences hunger or the risk of hunger. Many frequently skip meals or eat too little, sometimes going without food for an entire day. Approximately 33 million people, including 13 million children, have substandard diets or must resort to seeking emergency food because they cannot always afford the food they need.

About PAR (Plant a Row)

Launched in 1995, *Plant A Row* is a public service program of the Garden Writers Association and the GWA Foundation. I would like to encourage you to plant an extra row of produce this year and donate the surplus to local food banks, soup kitchens and service organizations to help feed America's hungry.

Organizations that will benefit

We have a great organization in town, Family Tree (thefamily-tree.org). This is from their web page:

For over three decades, Family Tree has provided innovative, life-changing services designed to end child abuse, domestic violence and homelessness. As the only organization in the state to address the interconnectedness among these issues, Family Tree is changing how individuals, families and communities see, respond to and overcome them. In the past year, Family Tree provided services to tens of thousands of people in efforts to empower individuals to discover their own strengths to create lasting, positive change. Family Tree has a homeless shelter in Arapahoe County for women and their families who are victims of domestic violence. It's called

House of Hope. My friends and I volunteer to provide a meal once a month for the house. The volunteer coordinator said they can always use fresh vegetables.

Another organization, The Gathering Place is at 1535 High Street. They provide a place where women, children and transgender who are experiencing poverty or homelessness can go during the day and get breakfast, lunch and a snack. Their spring newsletter put out the request for fresh vegetables as well.

Parking Changes for Recreational Vehicles

The Centennial City Council recently approved new guidelines for the parking of recreational vehicles on City streets, agreeing to amend the Municipal Code. With summer approaching it is important for those with camping trailers, fifth wheels, recreational trailers and motor homes be aware of these changes.

- The change most relevant for the majority of the Centennial residents allows camping trailers (including fifth wheels), motor homes, recreational trailers (which includes boat trailers) to be parked adjacent to the home of the registered owner of the vehicle for up to 48 hours at a time. There is a new required 24 hour "off-the-street" intervening period before a new 48 hour period commences. It is no longer limited only to time for active loading or unloading or being prepared for storage or service. In addition, the locational restriction which requires parking adjacent to the property of the RV or trailer owner is new.
- Recreational Vehicles of visitors may be parked adjacent to the residence being visited for up to 48 hours at a time (with the same required 24 hour "off-the-street" intervening period before a new 48 hour period commences) but may not be occupied as sleeping quarters. Previously, there was no time limit on visitors as long as they were in continued on page 8

an out-of-state registered vehicle.

- Unattached camper tops or boats may not be parked or placed in the street.
 This was not previously made explicit. Attached camper tops are not regulated.
- Any vehicle may be parked in an emergency situation, not to exceed 4 hours. This provision is unchanged.
- The opening of slide outs and the protrusion of any part of the recreational vehicle or trailer over or on the sidewalks, including the placement of any cords or hoses used for servicing, are prohibited from placement across the sidewalk. This was previously unaddressed.
- The placement of tarps or vehicle covers on RVs, boats or trailers parked in
 the street is prohibited except that custom fitted boat or recreational trailer
 covers or shrink wrap which are secured around the entire perimeter of the
 boat or recreational trailer are allowed.

"The hope is these changes balance the desires of those that find recreational vehicles in the street hinder the quality of life in our neighborhoods," says District 3 Council Member Mark Gotto. "Council also wanted to address safety issues that increase by RVs blocking traffic lanes and limiting clear paths of vision for children playing, traveling vehicles and pedestrians."
