The runners appreciated the many turns on the course and the few unexpected hills. The more laid back participants conversed and laughed and enjoyed the neighbors who brought out their hoses, sprinklers, squirt guns and slip-n-slides. A live band, Portabello Road, greeted race finishers. It was a terrific display of our awesome Southglenn community - those who live in it, and those who participate in it. The 5K event raised funds for Drennen's Dream Foundation, an organization promoting swimming pool safety established in memory of Drennen O'Melia, a Southglenn resident who drowned in a local pool four years ago.

Here's a brief update on our status. Our swim team is in operation with 109 swimmers, including an increase in numbers at the younger ages; the golf leagues are competing; we've put a new youth golf policy in place; and the course is in fantastic condition. I can now report that our legal issues have been resolved, having recently signed the final confidential settlement agreements. As a result, no club members or home owners in Southglenn will be adversely affected.

Despite this news and an improvement in our product, we experienced an unexpected decline in renewal memberships. We reviewed 200 remaining potential returning membership units and found that 80 did not plan to rejoin. We typically experience some renewal loss, and we wanted to understand why folks weren't returning, so we called them and discovered that the reasons were varied, and included the following: We didn't use the club; We've grown too old; Our children have grown up; We've moved; I have some health problems.

Here are things we did *not* hear: We don't like Southglenn; The course / pool / facilities were in bad condition; The staff treated me poorly; The club just isn't family friendly; The pool is too crowded and I can't get a lounge chair.

Hopefully you're getting the picture that the staff provides a quality experience for the membership and our facilities are well managed. As a board we expect future growth however we need interim financial help. As members we appreciate SGCC and want what's best for both the club and our surrounding neighborhood. This is the first step in what I expect to be an ongoing process to bring Southglenn back to prominence. In closing, please give what you can and keep the club alive.

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Sheriff's Office Launches Drug Drop Box Program

The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) has launched a Drug Drop Box Program that allows the public to safely and anonymously dispose of unused prescription and non-prescription drugs. The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office Drug Drop Box is intended to provide the public with a safe, convenient and responsible way to dispose of prescription and non-prescription medications. Statistics tell us that the main starting point for drug abuse is unused prescription drugs kept in a home. These unused medications can also cause accidental drug overdoses in children. We also recognize these medications can lead to groundwater contamination if flushed down a toilet. By using the Drug Drop Box, citizens can safely dispose of unwanted medications in a timely manner. The Sheriff's Office will then arrange for the safe and legal destruction of the accumulated materials in conjunction with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The Drug Drop Box is located in the lobby of the Sheriff's Office Headquarters Building, 13101 East Broncos Parkway, Centennial, CO. It is available to the public year-round during normal business hours (Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.), excluding holidays. Please follow the below listed instructions to utilize this service:

1. All medications must be placed into a clear plastic zip-lock bag.
2. The bags will be screened at the lobby entrance for compliance.
3. Once screened, the bags may be placed into the Drug Drop Box located in the lobby.

Fireworks are Illegal in Centennial

The 4th of July is just around the corner and fireworks stands are popping up throughout the metro area. Please remember the sale, use or possession of all forms of fireworks is against the law in Centennial. This ban includes retail fireworks stands and the lighting of fireworks that may have been purchased legally outside of the city. Professional fireworks displays conducted by state licensed firework operators are allowed only with proper permits obtained from the appropriate fire protection district.

Fireworks are defined very broadly in the Centennial ordinance. It covers all forms of fireworks, including bottle rockets, sparklers and snakes. The fireworks ban will be enforced by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office, along with local fire and code officials. The penalty for fireworks possession or sale is a maximum of \$1,000 for each offense.
