UPDATE ON LPS PROPOSAL TO CLOSE TWAIN ELEMENTARY

The recommendations from the LPS Long-Range Planning Committee were presented in a virtual town hall on March 2nd. You can visit the Committee's page

on the LPS website at littletonpublicschools. net/district/long-range-planning-committee. On that page you can watch the recorded town hall and look over the presentation.

Big Takeaways: As LPS works towards using the funds from the recent bond approval and mill levy override, smaller schools are being closed and consolidated into larger schools where economies of scale should drive some efficiencies. Most likely by the time you read this the recommendations of the Committee will have been presented to the LPS Board on March 30th.

After interviews with parents and staff at Twain, it appears that the decision to close Twain is a fait accompli. When the initial news reports of Twain closing appeared in the media, some parents decided to get their children into their first-choice open enrollment schools, with rumors on NextDoor driving decisions and creating a sense of urgency. Staff at Twain report that some of the 1st to 4th graders have already reported that they will not be attending Twain next year. The declining enrollment numbers undermine arguments to keep Twain open.

Still up in the air: You can still have an impact on the new borders to be adopted for how the new boundaries will split Southglenn. Currently the neighborhood is split between Twain, Franklin-Highland and Hopkins with Clarkson serving as the boundary line between Twain and Hopkins and Arapahoe serving as the boundary line between Twain and Franklin-Highland. There are three proposed new boundaries for fall of 2022. The Chestnut and Sycamore options will have all Twain students in Southglenn east of Clarkson go to the new Franklin Campus school and students to the west of Clarkson continue going to Hopkins with the Cherrywood neighborhood also going to Hopkins. The Maple option would have the same boundaries as the other two options, but with the Cherrywood neighborhood

(currently going to Twain) also going to the Franklin Campus school. The Maple option would preserve the current student body at Twain merging it with the Franklin-Highland student body.

Potential Future Problems: The Committee has kicked the problem of what to do with the Twain Elementary building and property down the road. As a community we will have to find consensus on what we don't want to happen at that property and make our voice heard before development at that parcel becomes another fait accompli.

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HOW TO TALK TO A SICK FRIEND

Whether your friend is suffering from the coronavirus, cancer, or just a bad cold, you want to be there for him or her. But what should you say to offer real comfort? The Healthline website offers this advice for sharing just the right words:

- Talk to the person, not the disease. Your friend or loved one is already dealing with sickness day in and day out. They may need a break. It's OK to ask how they're feeling and what they're doing to take care of themselves, but don't dwell on the illness exclusively. Talk about other subjects.
- **Be sensitive.** Don't pry or press for details. If you're a caretaker, pay attention to the person's moods and preferences. You may have to press for information that the person is reluctant to share for fear of taking up your time, or other reasons, but be respectful of their boundaries.
- **Be patient.** Your friend may not have time to talk right away, or may need a few minutes—or hours—to sort through his or her feelings before answering a question or responding to a text. Don't expect an instant response. Give them space to process their emotions on their own terms.
