

In Arapahoe County, this service is provided by the Arapahoe County E-911 Authority. In Aurora, this service is provided by the City of Aurora Citizen Alert System. When there is need to notify citizens about an emergency or potential safety concern, messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices (land line, mobile, email, text messaging, pager, fax, etc.) that you have registered in the system.


Please note that residents and businesses with land line phones are already listed in Arapahoe County and Aurora's 9-1-1 databases and do not need to be registered.

## SOUTHGLENN GATOR SWIM TEAM - STILL GOING STRONG!

Summer 2020 has been a year of uncertainty, with cancelled vacations, summer camps and typical warm weather activities. But if you happened to drive by Southglenn Country Club on a weekday morning this summer, you saw that one thing that has stayed the same - the giggles, smiles and camaraderie of the Gators summer swim team. At the start of the summer, Southglenn Country Club received word that the league had cancelled the summer swim competitions within the league. However, due to our amazing coaches and dedicated parent volunteers, the Southglenn Gators swim team was one of only a handful of summer swim clubs to offer an intra-squad summer swim league, giving nearly 100 swimmers from ages 6 to 18 a chance to keep up their conditioning and maintain the team spirit in a summer where connection is needed by so many.

"The Gator board members told our coaches at the start of the summer that we may not be able to pull off a swim program, and that we would understand if they wanted to seek employment elsewhere," said Jenny Dobmeier, president of the Gator board. "We were absolutely blown away when all 5 of our coaches said they would wait to see if

there would be a swim season. That's how dedicated our coaches are, and how much they love these kids."

Over the course of the 7-week program, the coaches added temperature checks, social distancing and constant disinfecting to their usual duties, and even implemented a new "time trial" program so that, since they weren't able to compete with other teams, kids could still maintain competition with themselves and have increased motivation to get faster and stronger throughout the season.

"It's definitely been an unusual season," agreed head coaches Courtney Helseth and Henry Kline. "But seeing the kids improve their strokes, cut time from their time trials, and just enjoy being part of a team environment has been amazing."

Although swim practices ended July 31, many Southglenn Gator swimmers are looking forward to continuing socially distanced summer fun with their swim team friends during free time at the pool, which will remain open until Labor Day weekend. Members can reserve 2-hour time blocks to beat this unseasonably hot summer heat and take advantage of a sliver of normalcy in an unusual time of their lives.
