

Update on Centennial HOUSING AFFORDABILITY STUDY

The City of Centennial is undertaking a year-long study of housing to explore housing costs and affordability in Centennial. The city received an Affordable Housing Development Grant from the state.

A housing needs workshop took place on 5/17/22. You can visit this link: https://urielakiva.substack.com/p/centennialhousing-needs-workshop?sd=pf to see the entire PDF. Links will also be posted on the substack and facebook pages.

Key takeaways from the group were that they supported adding to the stock of housing units in Centennial with smaller housing units. Units for older people downsizing and younger people starting up. Little support was show for rental units outside of the I-25 corridor adjacent to the light rail lines.

The Streets of SouthGlenn were repeatedly cited as the exactly wrong type of housing for Centennial.

"Fewer luxury apartments especially near Streets at SouthGlenn and along University. These cause congestion and they aren't making any difference in affordability. And those people may move into affordable townhomes someday and take away that housing stock from those who need it the most. Why is the city allowing all of those?"

It is that time of year to take stock in what we have achieved so far this year and look forward to where we can go. Last year we had a few positive developments. The memorial signs were finally installed and the movie nights at the park were begun. The participation and communication from the neighborhood remained high, with the membership overwhelming contacting us to register their dislike of the proposed rezoning of the Streets of SouthGlenn.

Last year ended with a thud as City Council approved the building of over 1000 apartments at the Streets of SouthGlenn.

Since that defeat however, the neighborhood has been on a roll. Our pressure campaign helped get the rock project on Dry Creek finally done after a generation of no progress. We have expanded the movie nights and gone to 100% virtual meetings.

Our investigative reporting has uncovered corruption and illegal activity, resulting in a win against CENCON and the district court not just finding in our neighborhood's favor, but ordering CENCON to pay our lawyer's fees. The Facebook page is again getting regularly updated, with several hundred followers. We created the Muppet based "snow threat level" monitor and publish regular updates of where the cheapest gas is in the SouthGlenn area. We have an account on NextDoor to try and push even more information out to the neighborhood.

Your Civic Association is working overtime to represent your interests because NEIGHBORHOODS REALLY DO MATTER. Thank you so much, we could not have done it without you.

EVERYONE AGREES: CEOS ARE PAID TOO MUCH

In these days of polarization, there's at least one issue that has bipartisan support: CEO pay is too high. Yahoo Finance reports that in a survey of 1,037 people conducted in February 2022, 81% of Democrats and 71% of Republicans agreed that most U.S. CEOs get paid too much.

Median pay for the CEOs of the top 100 U.S. companies rose 31% in 2021, to \$20 million—a record amount. The ratio of CEO pay to worker pay increased from 238:1 to 254:1.

The poll, sponsored by Just Capital, found that 81% of people feel that big companies should do what they can to provide their lowest-wage workers with basic security. Only 19% feel that companies have no responsibility for protecting their employees from poverty.




