We also donate to our schools and neighborhood projects like the playground equipment and electrical outlets now at Clarkson Park.



We have Dumpster Day, which is set up to help keep trash out of our neighborhood. Folks can get rid of the trash/junk from around their house. It helps keep our neighborhood clean from neighbors accumulating trash. The small amount we ask you to pay for dues is spread far and used wisely. After Fun Fest, we are now at about 405 members, which equals around \$8,100. Fun Fest alone is about \$2,500, and for Dumpster day is about \$3,000. Those are the only two things that we do that usually take more than we have membership money for. We have been saving for our monument signs for at least 20years. We have the plans, we have the signs and the engraver, but to have a company put them in the ground is about \$2,700 a sign. So the labor is more than the signs, even though we have a smoking deal on all 10 of the signs. We need to have at least 600 out of the 1385 home owners to participate every year to keep up with the tasks at hand. We also have a need for some new signs for the different functions and things we have going on in the neighborhood. These signs will help communicate if it is a meeting you need to come to, or an important function! The cost of them will only be about \$100-\$200 or more for the year. We want to give a hand-out at the next centennial and neighborhood

meetings where a lot of people are expected to attend. We will want people to be informed in writing as well, so it will all cost!

I just wanted the neighborhood to understand we do a lot more than an Easter Egg Hunt with candy. It is not just about the fun things we do in our neighborhood! We do very important things you can't always see behind the scenes like Cencon! Years ago, we the SGCA saved the library from them removing it from Southglenn, which is now an issue with the Streets of Southglenn's proposed changes. The Country Club is a huge property that is always a concern of ours, we want to keep it as it is, of course, but at least as open space, and that would take money to pay taxes and insurance on it!

WE the SGCA are always thinking of our neighborhood's best interest! It is never too late to pay your dues! It would be nice to have them in January each year so we know how much we have to work with, but we will take them anytime! We are working on more sponsorship through our community and we could not do a lot of things without our wonderful volunteers! Welcome Fall! Watch out for the children going back to school, so slow down. Be a good Neighbor!

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
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#### UPDATE FROM THE SGCC BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As school starts back up, and we wind down the summer season, the SGCC Board of Directors would like to communicate our appreciation to our members and our neighbors for their ongoing support. As a board, we have been working on building a strategic plan that enables the club to address ongoing deferred maintenance, debt

to irrigation bond holders, increased labor costs and increased operations costs.

One of the most challenging aspects for the board is to budget for these items appropriately, before knowing the final membership numbers each year. The budget is built in January, but our mem-

bership drives don't end until the beginning of June. In the past, we have addressed budget shortfalls through donations and fundraising. This year, however, we were forced to address deferred maintenance issues and the resulting expenses through a membership assessment, the first membership assessment in decades.

The SGCC Board of Directors is anticipating a dues increase for the 2020 season, which will account for ongoing maintenance expenses, as well as to adjust for the increases in labor and operations costs. Even with the

dues increase, Southglenn Country Club continues to be one of the best values in the area.

#### REDEVELOPMENT AT THE STREETS AT SOUTHGLENN

Since the last article, there's been another meeting with the developers with a small group of 10 of us from the Neighbors for Streets at SouthGlenn. We met with Don Provost (Alberta Development), Kyle Whitaker (Northwood Ravin) & Brian Cleary (Northwood Investors). The 90-minute meeting was open, direct and candid discussion. There was no negotiation but we did share our concerns and ideas. Below are notes and updates from the Aug 8th meeting. (By the way, as of Aug 19th, this group numbers 382 individuals from over a dozen neighborhoods surrounding the S@SG.)

But first, why a small group meeting? Well, partly for meeting organization and partly because of space. For example, finding a location large enough to safely and legally allow us to meet is difficult. We will have another large group meeting once the traffic study is completed and the developers have a revised plan to present.

Note: Often we'll count a two story as 20'. In other words, each "story" is equal to 10'. That's not accurate. It's better to calculate as 13' for each floor. So, four stories

equate to  $\sim$ 52'. The actual height might shift down to 12.5' per story, but the developers suggested using 13'.

Remember that the current "ask" is to amendment the blueprints (Master Development Plan) to:

- 1. Increase building height limit from 50' to 100'. Since March, the developers have said that they will be asking for less (perhaps 52'-78' to allow for 4-6 story building).
- 2. Reduce the total amount of retail from 909,815 to 500,000 sq feet. Likewise, this changes the ratio of mixed use (less retail and more residential).
- 3. Increase the number of allowed residential units from 350 units to a total of 1,950 units. Since March, the developers have said they will be reducing the count to an unspecified number.

#### We expressed our thoughts, concerns and suggestions:

- The group emphasized that getting commitments in writing is very important and we reviewed the history of Littleton Village and how it soured West-Centennial residents who now no longer trust elected officials, staff and developers to keep commitments.
- The traffic study is underway and has been extended an additional two weeks to account for the schoolyear traffic. The developer is adding traffic counters to update daily traffic counts.
- Traffic study is expected to continue into September and to be ready to be submitted to the city around late September or early October.

- We stressed our view that more community space and parks are in huge demand in West-Centennial.
- Adding both community spaces and parks will enhance and increase restaurant/retail traffic and make for more sales tax revenue, not less.
- The total number of units the developers are interested in building is being revised down from the March number of 1600 units. Both developers expect that their revised concepts will include less residential than initially presented.
- The developers have agreed and committed to having future communication, including providing our group with the plans (once updated and in a public form) so we can all meet to learn and discuss. They are open to as many meetings (within reason) as are helpful for the community to understand what they want to do, and to get our feedback on the development plans.

#### Next steps:

I expect that the next large group meeting will occur in late September/early October. The developer seems willing to find a venue large enough for all of us, and to attend the meeting to present their latest concepts and vision. Two key milestones need to be completed; traffic study and developer's revised plans.
