21 snowfall. Maximum diameter of branches that will be accepted is 12 inches. No lumber will be allowed in the chipper – it will have to go in the dumpster. We will also have metal and wire recycling available.

Here are some resources for getting out of your hair the items we cannot accept: TVs, computer screens, electronics, old phones, etc. - Best Buy will accept most of these, please check with them for restrictions and possible fees. Paint - Sherwin-Williams Paint Store will take a gallon or less per day. Green Sheen in Englewood will accept larger quantities. Oil and other oil based products can be recycled at the places you buy those products, for example used motor oil can be recycled at AutoZone. Tires can be recycled at a tire store for a small charge.

Have your stuff loaded the night before so you can get there early before it fills up!

We also have a person that helps people that cannot get their stuff to dumpster day for a donation or small fee. Call and Schedule now must have paid your dues to SGCA 303-795-8083.



CENTENNIAL AIRPORT FLIGHT-PATH IMPACT

I attended the NextGen community workshop at Arapahoe Community College on May 9. The NextGen project is the Federal Aviation Administration's effort to increase the safety and efficiency of air transportation across the country by modernizing America's air transportation system. Here is what I took away from that meeting.

Large, commercial airports, such as DIA, will rely on GPS satellites to track planes and assist with coordinating take-offs and landings as opposed to a ground-based navigation system that was originally developed over 50 years ago. To realize the increased safety, efficiency and environmental goals of the project at DIA, some changes to flight patterns at nearby regional airports are required. There are no proposed changes to DIA flight paths that will negatively impact our area. There are also no proposed changes for smaller, prop planes utilizing Centennial Airport. The potential concern for us would be private jet traffic at Centennial Airport. And to put this "concern" into perspective, Centennial Airport had an Average Daily Total Jet Arrival of 35 in 2018.

CITY CODE FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

In 2015 The Centennial City Council approved new guidelines for the parking of recreational vehicles on City streets, agreeing to amend the Municipal Code. Did you know that four years later Centennial City Council is considering city-wide restrictions of all recreational vehicles on private property? This would include any RV, boat, snowmobile, trailer, or other recreational-use vehicles taller than 6 feet. Also being discussed is requiring vehicles shorter than 6 feet be parked in a side or backyard behind a 6 foot fence to limit viewing the vehicle from the front street.

City Council discussed this issue in the April 8th Study Session. Both council members from District 1 support the idea. You can listen to a recording of the discussion beginning at 1:33:00. https://onbase.centennialco.gov/ OnBaseAgendaOnline/Meetings/ViewMeeting?id=1509&doctype=1)

As you consider this, keep in mind that Centennial includes rural areas zoned for agriculture and livestock as well as neighborhoods, some with HOAs. Some of us chose an HOA neighborhood, and some of us chose NOT to live in a neighborhood with any restrictions.

Last summer City Code was updated to address Proper Storage of Refuse Containers. Many in our neighborhood were blindsided by this. They did not know it was being contemplated and were upset when the Code was updated. Consider this your notice of what is being considered.

If you have thoughts on this, please reach out to our District 1 Representatives Candace Moon and Kathy Turley (cmoon@centennialco. gov and kturley@centennialco.gov) as they rely on citizen input to assess the community's needs. Now is the time to speak up and get involved.
