This column is the regular place where once a month you can get a little bit of very focused micropolitics. We do not examine normal partisan politics, but instead focus on the issues facing the local community.

Here are a few items we are watching, go to the substack for more information.

**State-Wide:** We will be doing some follow ups on how the members of the state legislature plan to vote next year if the "More Housing Now" bill comes back before the legislature. SB12-213 died in the last session only because it ran out of time, not votes.

**South Suburban Parks and Recreation:** First let's start with facts. On June 14th the SSPRD board selected Keith Gardner to fill the open seat on the board of directors. The response from some community members in attendance was to walk out of the meeting in protest.

I sent emails to the board of directors and all the candidates who were running for office in the last election. Only Alexis Barrere and Elizabeth Watson responded.

Keith Gardner had not sought a seat in the recent election and the board choose not to select any of the candidates from the last election. I filed a freedom of information request and discovered how Ken Lucas and Pam Eller were able to show up at people's houses the day they received their ballots. Starting in February Pam and Ken were requesting voter lists from the district. Then on March 27th Sue Rosser, on behalf of Pam Eller, started to request updates to the voter list and returned ballot list, every few days.

The official email to all candidates simply stated:

#### **Public Record Requests**

Requests for public records must be made via a Colorado Open Record Request. The link to make the request is www.ssprd.org/public-records-request.

On to opinion: I think it's safe to say that Elizabeth Watson, with her reform campaign, deep sixed any thought by the board of selecting a term limited member and instead they choose another insider, Keith Gardner. Keith was quoted as saying: "I totally hear everybody's




concern, and that's why one of the things I'm going to do is reach out to some of the folks and try to give them a level of confidence – vent if they need to – because I know they aren't happy with the process." Keith seems oblivious to the fact that his very appointment is what the community is unhappy with and that residents don't have confidence because insiders' game the system to keep outsiders out. The outsider candidates were at a huge disadvantage because, unlike Ken Lucas and Pam Eller, they didn't know that "Public Records Requests" is code for "list of people who requested absentee ballots, a list that is updated a few times a week and we can also tell you who has returned ballots."

**Action Items:** I know that people read my column and say to themselves, great, but what can I do. Here is where I'm going to tell you what I'm doing in response to this story.

I'm contacting the runner up candidates and sharing the way that Pam and Ken gamed the system.
 That insider knowledge of "who requested ballots and who turned them it" will be gone next election.

- The SSPRD shouldn't oversee running its own elections.
  The district should do what other special districts do and
  have the counties run it. I'll work with the runners up to
  form a coalition to reform the elections process and turn
  it over to the county.
- 3. And (4) Term limits should mean what the voters intended them to mean. Two terms, that's it. If you serve two terms you can't run or serve again, looking right at you Pam Eller. Vacancies too. The board cannot be allowed to select their insider buddies. In the future vacancies should be filled in the next available election. It is self-evident that the board cannot handle filling vacancies. Susan Pye, hiding behind the districts' attorney saying "We followed all the rules he told us to do" is simply unacceptable.

On the bright side. With this scandal plagued election one thing is clear, the old ways at SSPRD are over.

Thank you to Nina Joss at Colorado Community Media, her hard work was essential to much of this column. I used her quotes and she deserves credit for her hard work.

We had our first food truck night of the year. It was rainy and cold, so thanks to all who braved the weather and dropped by for a bite to eat. We continued on page 7







Visitors can see how its famous, handcrafted candy canes, ribbon candy and lollipops are pulled, twisted and shaped by hand – just like they were in 1920. The Mile High City is home to its one-and-only factory where guests can see how its famous candy is handmade and hand-packaged from beginning to end. It's a sweet treat you won't find elsewhere.

Tours are Monday – Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. No reservations required.

#### **GET FIRED UP!**

Located in historic Denver Fire Station No. 1, families will love the Denver Firefighters Museum (1326 Tremont Pl., Denver). The building was erected in 1909 and served as a working fire station until 1974. Follow the firefighters boot prints through the gallery to interact with the hands-on activities. Fire Safety Stops explore the exhibit themes on a child's level and teach important fire prevention lessons in a fun, non-threatening manner.

Activities include a 911 teaching phone, child size firefighting gear, children's pole and fire truck, and a touch cart full of real firefighting tools. Have those cameras ready.

Admission is \$9 for adults, \$8 for seniors (ages 65 and above) and students with valid I.D. and \$6 for children (ages 2-12). Open Tuesday to Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Closed Mondays and major holidays.

#### A BILLION DOLLAR EXPERIENCE

Visitors will learn about the history of the United States Mint (20 W. Colfax Ave., Denver) and how coins are produced for the American public. After the FREE tour, stop by the gift shop to check out the unique memorabilia for sale. Sorry, no samples on this tour.

Tours run Mondays through Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The guided tour lasts about 45 minutes. Being home to so much money, security is extremely tight. You won't be allowed to carry in purses, cameras, pens, lipstick, strollers, diaper bags, or cell phones.

#### ROCK ON AT SCHOOL OF MINES GEOLOGY MUSEUM

You'll find minerals, fossils, gemstones, meteorites, woolly mammoth bones and even an actual moon rock, collected during the Apollo 17 mission, at the Mines Museum of Earth Science (1310 Maple St., Golden; 303-273-3815). The museum serves as the state repository for Colorado's mineral heritage with specimens from around the world. Be sure to check out the basement level filled with exhibits on radioactivity, fossils, gemstones, meteorites, ultraviolet minerals and underground mining illumination. There's also an outdoor geologic trail and small play area for the kiddos. If you find a cool rock or other specimen, bring it in between 10 a.m. and noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays when a geologist is on hand to help you identify it.


