FAA FLIGHT PATH CHANGES — COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Centennial Airport is one of the busiest non-commercial airports in the nation. As a result of the Federal Aviation Administration's nationwide program to upgrade its Air Traffic Control System. Centennial Airport will need to change one of its most-used approach routes that will have planes flying low over Littleton, Centennial, Greenwood Village.

Before implementing its Denver Metroplex Project, the FAA is required to conduct an Environmental Assessment (EA). This EA will include a dozen Public Workshops in the area (Centennial Airport is not the only regional airport that will be affected) and a 45 day public comment period from April 22 through June 6.

The Metroplex implementation in other areas of the country has not gone well. Maryland (BWI, Reagan Airports), Southern California (Hollywood Burbank) and Phoenix have sued the FAA over implementation of the changed flight paths and noise concerns. DO YOU KNOW WHAT IS HAPPENING AT SOUTHGLENN SHOPPING MALL?

Just in case you haven't been reading your newsletter or going to the meetings? Our Southglenn mall is likely going to turn into more apartments at The Streets of Southglenn. That's on top of the 202 apartments that are already there. Where will they build all of these, you ask? The old Sears building and the adjacent parking lots. The preliminary plans look like it will consume all of that area backing up to the sidewalk on Easter Ave.

After the Sears property redevelopment, Macy's will undergo a similar redevelopment of the store and the parking lot directly east of the store. The Macy's property redevelopment could eventually include more apartments up to 6 stories high with underground parking along with a little retail and office space in the near future. If you would like the city of centennial to have another community meeting to explain this, you must call the city and request another community meeting. They have the plans with pictures and all the information. 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
ANNUAL MEETING
