SRD WRAP-UP

Dale Rottschafer and Pat Benhmida, SRD Committee Co-Chairs

As you've no doubt heard by now, the SRD initiative did not pass. The results were:

	YES	NO
Total Votes (630)	274(43%)	356(57%)
Residents (444)	52%	48%
Dues Paying Members (186	5) 23%	77%

The initiative needed 2/3 majority of the cast ballots for the measure to pass. As you can see, we didn't overcome that threshold even in the neighborhood alone. But in spite of outside money and disinformation, we did get a majority *continued on page 2*

SSPRD BOARD OF DIRECTOR CANDIDATES

The South Suburban Parks and Recreation District (SSPRD) is holding a polling place election on Tuesday May 8th . The election is to choose three new members for the Board of Directors. The Board is made up of five members. No incumbents are running. Why is this important? The SSPRD 2018 budget is just shy of 65 million dollars. The property tax that supports SSPRD is 8.496 mils, which translates into a typical house in Southglenn paying about \$225 a year in taxes towards SSPRD. Below are brief quotes of each candidate (alphabetical), but you can read their full bios and contact them if you want by going to ssprd.org/elections.

How to vote: There are 4 open polling places, Goodson Recreation Center is the closest polling place to Southglenn, the polls will be open from 7AM-7PM on the 8th. The deadline for requesting an absentee ballot is May 1 at ssprd.org/election. There are 9 candidates running for the 3 open positions.

• Jerry Bakke: "My goal in running for the South Suburban Board is to contribute my expertise and knowl-

edge to ensure that each District Member has a quality experience that is delivered in a fiscally responsible way."

• **Pete Barrett:** "My wife and I moved into the South Suburban District in 1969 and raised two daughters who played on the playgrounds, swam in the pools, skated at the rink and played baseball, basketball and soccer. Today our four granddaughters, ages two to eleven, are doing all of those things plus dancing and celebrating their birthdays at South Suburban parks and facilities. "

• **Charlie Blosten:** "For 38 years, I was the City of Littleton Public Works Director; responsible for all parks, trails and open space projects in Littleton. I retired in 2015."

• Michael G. Kohut: "I have never be Elected or Appointed to serve on any Board or Commission in the past due to Employment & Family Obligations. I have however served on several Different Types of Committees."

• **Dave Lawful:** "There are over \$138 million in planned projects to add to and improve South Suburban facilities in the next 5 years. Appropriate oversight relies on solid


project management and planning skills, which I have developed in my private sector career."



3. Make it a game. Think about where you are going and what you might see. Ask how many different colored cowboy boots can you find? Or how many gelato flavors can you try? Make a list of famous buildings and turn it into a scavenger hunt. Turn sightseeing into a game is an easy way to engage your kids. Give them a challenge during your trip. If they complete the challenge, reward them. An example could be a dinner of their choice.
