FREE LEAF RECYCLING!

The cities of Littleton and Englewood are continuing the annual leaf-recycling program for the south metro area. In the previous twenty five years of the program, 33,500 cubic yards of leaves have been recycled. Collection dates and time are: Saturday, November 3 and 10 from 8am to 1pm at A1 Organics Mountain States – 2300 W Radcliff Avenue, Englewood CO 80110.

There is no Littleton or Englewood residency requirement for the free leaf drop-off. Bring leaves in bags, trash cans or tarped loads. Residents with tree branches, shrubs, and/or mixed loads of organic recyclables, as well as lawn service companies or other commercial ventures will be charged regular gate fees of \$12 per cubic yard. A1 Organics Mountain States will provide vouchers for reduced-price landscape product purchases to program participants. For more information, call 303-795-3766.

good turnout, great questions and lively discussion.

For the recent SGCC annual meeting, attendance was a bit light. Roughly 40 people were in attendance. Residents returned about 140 ballots. That's barely over 10% of our residents. While this is more ballots than have been returned in years when there are no proposed bylaws changes, it is quite a bit less than voted in the special meeting in April. At the meeting they noted the significant increase in membership the past season, and the improved revenue over previous years. No doubt these are things worthy of celebration, but SGCC is not out of the woods yet. We need our residents to stay engaged, stay informed and get involved – consider joining while they are running promotional rates during the fall campaign.

In late September, there was a meet the candidates forum at the club. All nine candidates spoke and answered questions from those in attendance. All candidates essentially agreed that the current trajectory of the club was a positive one and they spoke about ideas to increase membership, decrease attrition and provide more events for the membership and community. The SGCA evaluated candidates and issued endorsements of 6 out of the 9 candidates based upon past performance, leadership abilities, experience, qualifications and statements at the candidates forum.

In a change from the normal procedure, the votes were not counted on the night of the annual meeting, but instead the deadline for voting was moved to noon on the following day. On October 10th the results of the election were released with Bob Batchelor, Sandy Schell and Eric Spaulding winning re-election and Liliana Westphal winning her first term on the board. As of the time this article went to press the SGCC has not provided actual vote totals for all 9 candidates.

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Bob Batchelor gave an extended e-mail interview. In the interview, he expressed that he was grateful for the endorsement of the SGCA, and that he did not reject the endorsement of the SGCA. His main concern was about the division between residents and non-resident members. "Let's stop talking about them [Southglenn Country Club and Southglenn Civic Association] as they are two different entities, they are all members of the club." Bob's main point throughout the interview was that current board shouldn't be judged by the sins of the past boards and that the current board is going to treat residents and non-resident members the same and even offering residents discounted membership based solely upon their ownership.

Sandy Schell, now the Dean of the board as the longest serving member, stated that she was not going to seek a leadership position in the board but instead to serve "wherever the board thinks I can do the most good." When asked about her longevity on the board she attributed it to the dedication and hard work she has put in at the club. Sandy stated that one of the ways to help mend the divide between the SGCC and the SGCA would be to have the two boards and the members work together more often.

Lili Westphal responded to a question about what her specific goals were and she stated that she wanted to continue the increase in membership and to help the board focus on long term strategic planning.

Eric Spaulding expressed his goals for the next two years as creating value for the membership at the club and that the club grows into "an essential institution, a place for our members and neighbors to get together and build lifelong relationships...a place that has something to offer everyone in the community."


