Southglenn Country Club Election Candidate Recommendations

Fifty years ago when Southglenn was built, the Southglenn Country Club (SGCC) was given to the residents of Southglenn neighborhood to manage.

The neighborhood created the non-profit that is Southglenn Country Club and after 25 years of keeping it viable, the developer deeded ownership of the property to SGCC. At that time, membership was limited to residents of Southglenn and each homeowner got one vote on matters brought up during annual and special meetings.

Over the years, the membership was expanded to include non-resident members, but just by owning a home in Southglenn, *you still retain a say in the management of the club with your vote*.

Each year the 1330 residents of Southglenn receive ballots for the election of the Board of Directors to the Southglenn Country Club (SGCC).

This past year, with five new directors, the fresh new board made great strides in creating a more transparent, vibrant and harmonious culture — and attracting over 260 new members. The club's financial situation has improved — nearly \$100,000 more in revenue than last year. The board also hired a new general manager to operate the club. We believe these positive results are a direct result of neighborhood involvement. In 2017, more of us voted to elect this board than in any prior election.

We highly encourage you to keep this positive momentum going and vote for the 2018 candidates that will best lead the club in the direction that best serves both the club *and* the Southglenn community.

Ballots will be arriving the first week in October for the annual meeting on October 9. We encourage you to return your ballot and attend the annual meeting on October 9th.

This year, nine candidates are running for the four open positions on the seven-member SGCC board of directors. You can read the full candidate bios when you receive them included with your ballot.

SGCC held a forum on September 25 to meet the nine candidates. Each candidate had an opportunity to give a short pitch as an introduction and explanation of why he or she is running for the board, and answered questions that were posed to them. Members of the Southglenn Civic Association were present, as well as a few Southglenn residents and non-residents members. Less than 20 attended this event.

If you can't make it to the meeting, we offer you here (reverse side) the candidates we think are the most promising, based on our experience of them at the September 25th forum, their answers to our questions, and their record and/or experience on the SGCC Board.

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



let the SGCA know of their intent. **Tanya Hedges and Lili Westphal** have also announced their candidacies for the SGCC board of directors.

STAY SAFE ON THE SCARIEST NIGHT OF THE YEAR

Children and parents alike enjoy Halloween—the costumes, and the candy, and the chance to spend some time together. Just remember to keep your young trick-ortreaters safe as you go door to door. Here are some tricks for collecting treats without danger:

- Costumes. Whether you buy your child a costume or make one, be sure it will be highly visible to cars and passersby. Bright colors and reflective tape will help youngsters show up on the dark streets.
