## SOUTHGLENN COUNTRY CLUB, PRESENT AND FUTURE

As you read from the SGCC President in last month's newsletter, the Southglenn Country Club is in a much better position financially than this time a year ago when they were nearly forced to close the pool early. The residential rates offered this spring enticed many new members from our neighborhood – essentially doubling the number of resident members. For those who have been members for more than one year, the experience of membership was so much better than in the recent past. I believe there are two reasons for this: 1) everything is better with friends, and 2) SGCC has offered members more functions to help create and foster friendships and improve the culture.

The current SGCC board deserves high praise for the work they have done to stabilize the situation. That said, SGCC is not out of the woods yet. It is unclear if the surge in membership was result of the SRD initiative, or if there is a lasting commitment from our residents to its long-term success. I hope it is the latter.

One way to assure lasting commitment from our residents for its long-term success is for residents to get more involved. This October, there will be four director seats open at the annual meeting. Last February, two of the SGCC Directors resigned and their terms are being completed by Bob Bachelor and Southglenn resident, Eric Spaulding. Both of these men ran for the board last fall, and despite not being elected at that time, both remained engaged with the board and were obvious choices to fill the vacant seats. The two of them plan to run again to continue the positive momentum that has been created, which is fantastic news. **This leaves two director seats vacant —Won't you consider throwing your hat in the ring to fill one of them?**

## ALARMING NUMBER OF CAR BREAK-INS

On any day, if you log on to Nextdoor, you're sure to find a post about someone's car or truck broken into or stolen. Two recent posts warned that the thieves are now carrying guns and threatening the owners when confronted. This is a crime wave like we've never seen before. Each incident has been reported to the Arapahoe Sherriff's Dept. But we must be extra vigilant safeguarding our autos and households. Here are some great tips neighbors shared, for thwarting these criminals.

- Lock your car. (Duh, I know, right? But it could happen the one time you forget.)
- If your car is broken into, make sure they didn't get your garage door opener. Otherwise, your whole household is vulnerable.
- Keep keys with a car alarm button on your nightstand, If you hear someone, push the alarm button to scare them off, and call the cops.
- Keep a baby monitor on your dashboard and its mate on your nightstand. You might be able to catch them even if they steal your vehicle.
- Keep your valuables out of sight or better yet, remove valuables from your car. Even something as simple as a phone charger is an attraction.
- Thieves are also looking for your registration papers, checks, receipts...anything with your name on it. Identity theft is lucrative.
- Park your car in your locked garage, if you can.
